

The first meeting of the Eastvale Community Committee started w/an introduction of Supervisor John Tavaglione and his staff and what living in the "county" is all about. He also gave us the boundaries for Eastvale which are the 15 fwy on the east, Santa Ana River on the south, county line (around Archibald) to the west and Bellegrave to the north.

The speaker for this meeting was George Johnson, Director of the Riverside County Transportation Department. His department's project that pertain to our area are as follows:

Limonite & Hamner to be expanded to 6 lanes (3 in each direction) - currently underway expected to be completed on or before August, 2003

New exit from the 15 fwy at Galena to be called Cantu/Galliano Ranch Road exit - start date of April, 2004 (down Hamner by the Grainger building)

The bridges on River Road and Hamner to be increased from 2 lane to 4 lane - probably 5 years. Dealing w/the Army Corp of Engineers is slowing this process.

Starting in Feb. of 2003, builders were required to pay an additional \$6,650 per unit in fees to improve roads.

Schleisman will go straight thru to the 15 fwy - but probably not in our lifetime.

We also discussed some difficulties various neighborhoods were having with regard to motorhomes, boats and big rig trucks being parked on the streets. Mr. Tavaglione suggested that calls be placed to his office and his Code Enforcement team would look into the matter. His office number is (909) 955-1020 - ask for Ann Stevens.

You can also contact the CHP. They are responsible for traffic issues in our area. The community affairs officers are ARMANDO PEDROZA and/or SCOTT McLAUGHLIN and their number is (909) 637-8000.
